1 HEART RATE
28-44 Beats Per Minute (Depending on the Horse's Size)



2 RESPIRATION
10 - 24 Breaths Per Minute



3 TEMPERATURE 99.5°F - 101.3°F Normal



4 MUCOUS MEMBRANES
The Horse's Gums Should Be Moist And
Healthy Pink



5 CAPILLARY REFILL TIME
Firmly Press Your Finger Against The Horse's
Gums, The Point of Pressure Should Return To
A Pink Color Within 1-2 Seconds.



6 INTESTINAL SOUNDS

Normal Gurgling, Gas-Like Growls, Tinkling
Sounds and Occasional Roars are Normal. No
Intestinal Sounds or Decreased Intestinal
Sounds Can Be A Sign Of Colic.



DEHYDRATIONHorse's Drink a Minimum of 5.25 Gallons of Water / Day.

Horse's in Heavy Exercise or Not Conditions Can Drink Up to 18.5 Gallons of Water / Day.

It Is Important To Know Your Horse's Vital Signs, As They Are Early Indications of Problems.

If The Horse Is Excited Or It's A Hot/Humid Day, Heart and Respiratory Rates Can Be Slightly Elevated.
